RM4m drugs found in walls

> Geng Ah Tee Jinjang suspect leads cops to 94kg stash

KUALA LUMPUR: When police busted “Geng Ah Tee Jinjang” last month and found an underground drug lab, little did they know that hidden within the walls of the premises were drugs worth some RM4 million.

At about 7pm on May 2, a team from the KL Narcotics Criminal Investigation Department detained four locals, including a woman, aged between 36 and 53 near a hotel in Jalan Pasar Baru.

One of the suspects had a packet of methamphetamine.

Investigations revealed the suspects were remnants of the gang, which was operating the drug lab at a house in Taman Bukit Idaman in Batu Caves, Selangor.

“Following further

interrogation, the woman led us to the same house where the lab was, where we found 94 packets of methamphetamine hidden in the walls,” city police chief Comm Datuk Seri Mazlan Lazim told a press conference yesterday.

The drugs, weighing about 94kg, has a street value of more than RM4 million.

“One kilogramme of methamphetamine is worth roughly RM50,000 at market price.

“This gang has been active for the past one year.

“The case is solved with the arrests of all the suspects,” Mazlan said.

The suspects, who also tested positive for drugs, have been remanded for further investigations under Section 39B of the Dangerous Drugs Act 1952.
