Penang suspect arrested at Suvarnabhumi Airport on Tuesday

source who was involved in the interrogation of the man, the sus-pect had allegedly beaten and tortured friends of two syndicate members who failed to smuggle drugs into Malaysia late last

"He beat and tortured their (syndicate members') friends and sent chilling images of the towo syndicate members after they failed to smuggle the drugs into Malaysia," said the source. The two Malaysian syndicate police last December in Chum-phon, southern Thailand, with 40 bars of heroin weighing 52.4kg and 41.9kg of "crystal" methamphetamine stashed in their car.

The final destination of the drugs was believed to be Penang. The police, he said, knew which car was used by the two Malaysians to transport the drugs as it was bought by the Penang man in Bangkok, adding that the man had also been implicated in the discovery of 87kg of "ice" at a Hatyai house in January this year.

"His arrest (in Suvarnabhumi "His arrest (in Suvarnaonumi Airport) two day ago was a cul-mination of police efforts since late last year," the source said, adding that the man, who had been described as a "big fish", had been under surveillance by

the authorities ever since he arriving in Thailand about two weeks ago. The source also said that the suspect spoke fluent Thai and

"He also has a fake Thai iden-tity card," the source said, adding that the man led a lavish lifestyle in Thailand.

in Thailand. The suspect, according to the source, had been in the Fang dis-trict in Chiang Mai, northern Thailand, recently to order drugs but negotiations with an uniden-tified party failed to materialise, prompting him to fly back to Bangkok before he was arrested by police

Bangkok before he was arrested by police. The source also said that the suspect had admitted to travel-ling to Thailand at least 10 times a year to conduct drug activities. He also confessed to being in-volved in drug-dealing activities for more than 20 years and had been imprisoned by Malaysian authorities twice for drug of-fences. fences.

fences. The suspect was brought to court yesterday under heavy po-lice escort for remand. His arrest followed another high-profile arrest of a Malay-sian, dubbed "Mr T" from Johor, who is suspected of being a key member of an international drug syndicate last Wednesday at the Hatyai airport. **Bernama**
