Family of five turns home into drug centre

# Family of five turns home into drug centre

**KUALA LUMPUR** — Police have nabbed a family of five, including two teenagers, who are believed to have sold drugs from their home in Bandar Baru Ampang for about a year.

Police raided their condominium unit cum drug repackaging centre at 5.30pm on Tuesday.

Ampang Jaya police chief ACP Hamzah Alias said those arrested were the 37-year-old head of the family, his wife, 35, a son, 15, daughter, 17, and an adopted son, 33.

The teenagers were school dropouts who had disciplinary issues.

“It is too early to ascertain the role of the children, but they were aware of the illicit activities run by their parents,” he said.

Hamzah said the family had repackaged syabu into 0.5g packets for RM100 each and

heroin in 3g packets for RM50 each to be sold to drug addicts in the Ampang area.

Police seized a weighing scale, an electric sealer, and almost 1kg of drugs worth RM33,500 from two rooms in the house.

Initial investigations revealed the father had four previous criminal convictions and he and his wife were both unemployed.

He said the adopted son tested positive for drugs and the children were present during the raid. All have been remanded until Monday.
