

Police nab four from drug syndicate

KUALA LUMPUR (Aug 7, 2013): Police nabbed four suspected of being active in a drug trafficking and car theft syndicate in Klang Valley for the past one year.

Brickfields deputy police chief Supt Aida Abdul Hamid said two women, 31 and 36, were picked up about 1 pm yesterday in front of a Jalan Kuchai Lama condominium.

"Their arrest led to another raid at a Jalan Kuchai Maju 2 condominium where two men aged 32 and 33 were detained," she told a press conference here today.

She said about 51 grammes of Eramin 5 and 24 grammes of methamphetamine worth RM50,000 and an immobilizer meant to defuse car alarms were seized from the condominium.

"We also found drug paraphernalia, a knife, eight mobile phones, RM3,450 in cash and several Hong Kong currency notes," she said adding that of them tested positive for drugs and one of them had a previous criminal record.

They have been remanded to facilitate investigations, she added. - Bernama
