RM2.2 million drugs seized from processing lab bust

RM 2.2 million drugs seized from processing lab bust

GEORGE TOWN - Police uncovered a drug processing laboratory and confiscated various types of drugs valued at RM2.2 million in raids earlier this week.

During the raids on Monday and Tuesday, three suspects were arrested, including a couple, and cash, valuables and six cars worth RM1.069 million believed to be proceeds from from drug trafficking were

Penang police chief Datuk Chuah Ghee Lye said acting on information police nabbed a 52-year-old man in the car park of a condominium in Solok Tanjung Bungah, diamond locket, two branded watches, as at about 9.15pm on Monday.

"The man led police to a house in Sungai Pinang, which also doubled as a drug processing laboratory," he told reporters yesterday.

they are members of a drug processing and trafficking syndicate, which has been active in the state for the past four months. The man detained on Monday is also believed to be an expert in drug processing.

"The second man, owns a shop selling chemicals in Butterworth, is believed to have supplied chemicals to the syndicate, while

the woman is an employee of the shop.
"The three have been remanded until May 15 to facilitate investigations," he added. - Bernama
