

Two drug addicts nabbed for trying to bribe cops

KUANTAN (Jan 10, 2014): An attempt by two men to bribe the police with RM1,453 to have them freed from detention and undergoing a urine test was not only unsuccessful but may land both with a jail term and fine.

Raub district police chief, Supt Wan Mohd Samsudin Wan Osman said the duo, suspected to be drug addicts, were nabbed by a Raub police narcotics team at about 12.30am today during "Ops Tapis" in town while inside a Proton Saga car.

He said one of the suspects, in his 20s, handed over an envelope to a policeman while the second suspect, in his 40s, handed over a tissue box to a police officer as inducement to release them while being taken to the police station to undergo a urine test.

"Upon examining the envelope and tissue box, the police found cash amounting to RM1,435," he told *Bernama*, here, today.

He said the first suspect still had a pending case involving a drug offence under Section 12 (2) and Section 15 (1)(a) of the Dangerous Drugs Act 1952.

Wan Mohd Samsudin said the second suspect also had eight previous criminal records involving drug abuse and crime.

Both suspects tested positive for drugs and are being remanded at the Raub district police station. – *Bernama*
